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**The Wyman Teen Leadership Program selection process is rigorous.** Before nominating any student, please carefully consider their preparedness to embrace the challenge of the Wyman Teen Leadership Program. Youth who do not meet the minimum qualifying criteria will not be considered. Nominating a child, whether or not they are accepted, is recognition for service to the local community.

**The Wyman Teen Leadership Program is** designed to keep a student with promise on track and to help him/her achieve their fullest potential as a student, as a leader, and as a contributor to the community. The Wyman Teen Leadership Program **is not** designed to address the needs of children who are under-performing or not yet ready for the long-term commitment required.

Wyman Teen Leadership Program campers have the opportunity to attend a 4-week overnight camp session each summer for 3 years. There are leadership workshops throughout the year, and other social events. In order to return to camp each summer, campers must attend follow-up events and be involved with community service in their school and neighborhood. Campers who do not satisfy all elements of the year round component of the program do not continue with the program.

Nominees with high potential for admission to the Wyman Teen Leadership Program display qualities like these:

- Currently in 7<sup>th</sup>
- Doing well in school; minimum grade point average of 2.5
- Positive attitude; history of appropriate behavior in school & the community
- Consistent and reliable adult support
- Leadership potential & desire to be successful
- Respects peers and people in positions of authority

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Wyman Teen Leadership Program opportunities are intended for students whose families are not able to provide enriching experiences like these due to a lack of financial resources.

**The Wyman Teen Leadership Program is a *leadership development* program. We do not expect nominees to already be performing at an "outstanding" level on the following measures. Please respond honestly.**

"Outstanding" infers that this student is among the top 5% when compared to his or her peers. "Better than Average" means he/she is in the top 25%. Adequate means that a student's ability lies in the middle. "Below Average" indicates that he or she is less prepared than most other students.
